TUITION REFUND POLICY

The policy of the Catholic Board of Education regarding tuition refund is as follows:

If a student leaves <u>within 1-2 weeks</u> from the start of the term, the parent is entitled to $\underline{75\%}$ refund on tuition.

If a student leaves <u>within 3-4 weeks</u> from the start of the term, the parent is entitled to 50% refund on tuition.

If a student leaves after 4 weeks from the start of the term, there is NO REFUND.

*REGISTRATION, TESTING, CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT AND SPECIAL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE AND NON-TRANSFERABLE.

RULES AND REGULATIONS - HAIR

The policy handbook of Saint Thomas More School speaks about the hair of our scholars. **Effective, Monday, March 4, 2024**, all students must comply with the following rules and regulations:

GIRLS:

NO weave or hair extensions

NO hair beads or jewels

NO nail polish

NO hair coloring or dyes

*Braided hair is allowed but must be all natural - no shingles or locked styles!

BOYS:

Traditional hair cut

Short and neatly trimmed

(No afros or braided hair, no locs, designs, faddish paths, dyes, tails or buds) Hair length must be above the collar of the shirt

SCHOOL UNIFORM

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Students are to be dressed in complete uniform at all times. Girls are allowed to wear one pair of **KNOB** earrings and a watch. Hair extensions, nail polish, body piercings and tattoos are not allowed. The boys are allowed to wear only a watch. Boys are not allowed designs or plaits in their hair or earrings. No other jewelry is allowed.

<u>Girls in Kindergarten to Grade 3</u> must wear jumpers with a wide flare skirt with the school's STM monogram on the upper left breast of the jumper, along with a white Peter Pan collar blouse.

<u>Girls in Grades 4 - 6</u> must wear wide flare skirts with a navy blue belt. A white Peter Pan collar blouse with the school's STM monogram on the left pocket is to be worn.

Boys in Kindergarten to Grade 3 must wear navy blue dress pants (**short**), a black belt and a white cotton shirt with the STM monogram on the left pocket.

<u>Boys in Grades 4 - 6</u> must wear a navy blue dress pants (<u>long</u>), a black belt and white cotton shirt with the STM monogram on the left pocket.

*ALL STUDENTS MUST WEAR NAVY BLUE SOCKS AND BLACK SHOES WITH THE SCHOOL UNIFORM. White socks should be worn with the P.E. uniform. <u>ALL STUDENTS SHOULD COME TO SCHOOL DRESSED IN THEIR P. E. ATTIRE FOR CLASS.</u> P. E. KITS ARE AVAILABLE IN THE OFFICE FOR \$30.00.



SUMMER CAMP

All students from Kindergarten – Grade 5 are strongly encouraged to attend the summer camp program at Saint Thomas More School. <u>It will be held for four (4) weeks from June 24, 2024 - July 19, 2024, Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.</u>. Language Arts, Writing, Mathematics and Science will be emphasized along with other activities. The brochure and application forms are available in the office.

The cost for the four (4) weeks of Summer Camp is \$360.00 which is due on or before Friday, June 21, 2024.

PARKING

The area on the side of the new hall (old church) has been designated as <u>TEACHER</u> <u>PARKING</u>. Parents/guardians should find other places to park in the mornings and in the afternoons. The lanes in front of the pavilion area are for dropping off only. <u>Please do not ignore the 'NO PARKING SIGNS"</u>.

Parents should be considerate when driving on the school grounds and obey the parking rules. **DO NOT BLOCK THE ENTRANCE AND EXIT GATES**. We have a limited amount of parking spaces, so please limit your time on campus. Drop your child off and allow him/her to walk to their class. Please do not block the entrance of the rectory. Father Junior has to be able to move in and out freely, especially in the mornings and afternoons.



ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL ON TIME

The first bell rings at <u>8:15 a.m</u>. The second bell rings at <u>8:30 a.m</u>. which begins our school day. <u>Tardiness is harmful both to your child's education and to the class that is being disrupted by your child's late arrival to school.</u>



SCHOOL DISMISSAL

There are two (2) dismissal times: They are as follows:

- Kindergarten Grade 2: Pick up at 2:50 p.m.
- Grades 3 6: Pick up at 3:00 p.m.

Parents should wait near the security booth until their child is brought to the pavilion area by the teacher.

SICKNESS PROTOCOLS

- <u>Children with a fever, cough, runny nose or congestion are not allowed in school regardless of a possible history of allergies or asthma.</u>
- A child who is **off sick** for any reason should not return to school until he/she is free of all symptoms.
- When a doctor's letter confirming that a child is fit to return to school has been requested, a copy of this letter must be reviewed by the school nurse before the child can be admitted to school.
- Students are encouraged to keep masks in their school bags as they will be needed if the scholar feels sick during school hours.
- A child who comes to school sick or who develops symptoms during the school day will be seated on the bench near the office and a parent or guardian will be called to collect the child. The office has a clear view of the child sitting on the bench.
- Additionally, please be reminded that <u>children should not come to school with</u> <u>medication in their bags.</u> Only prescribed medication with a pharmacy label, the child's name and the dosage will be administered. This includes over the counter medication.
- All medical information is **private and confidential**.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE

After school care runs from 3:00 p.m.– 5:00 p.m., Monday – Thursday. The facilitators are Mrs. Chea (tchea@cec.edu.bs) and Miss Philips (sphilips@cec.edu.bs). The cost is \$10.00 per day. After school care provides students with homework assistance for all subjects.

<u>Persons who are not engaged in an afternoon activity will automatically be placed in after care at 3:30 p.m. and charged the daily rate.</u>



SECURITY MEASURES

Parents are **<u>strongly advised</u>** not to leave valuable possessions in their car at any time. It is important to be **<u>PROACTIVE</u>** and **<u>PREVENT INCIDENCES</u>** of theft occurring on our campus.
