The policy of the Catholic Board of Education regarding tuition refund is as follows:

If a student leaves <u>within 1-2 weeks</u> from the start of the term, the parent is entitled to 75% refund on tuition.

If a student leaves <u>within 3-4 weeks</u> from the start of the term, the parent is entitled to 50% refund on tuition.

If a student leaves after 4 weeks from the start of the term, there is NO REFUND.

*REGISTRATION, TESTING, CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT AND SPECIAL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE AND NON-TRANSFERABLE.



SECURITY MEASURES

- A security officer is posted on campus from <u>8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.</u>., Monday through Friday.
- Please respect the authority of Mr. James Cepoudi who has been placed at Saint Thomas More School for your child's safety.
- The area on the side of the old church has been designated as <u>TEACHER PARKING</u>. Parents/guardians should find other places to park in the mornings and in the afternoons. The lanes in front of the pavilion area are for dropping off only. <u>Please do not ignore the "NO PARKING SIGNS".</u>
- Parents should be considerate when driving on the school grounds and obey the parking rules. **DO NOT BLOCK THE ENTRANCE AND EXIT GATES**. We have very few parking spaces, so please limit your time on campus. Drop your child off and allow him/her to walk to the class. Please do not block the entrance of the rectory. Father Junior must be able to move in and out freely, especially in the mornings and afternoons.
- Visitors on the campus of Saint Thomas More School are first asked to "Sign in" at the Security booth then proceed to the office.
- Parents who are collecting students ahead of dismissal must report to the school's office to receive an early dismissal slip before proceeding to the classroom to collect the child.
- Parents who are sending someone to pick up their child before dismissal must send an email to administrators giving authorization for such person to take the child.
 Authorization must be given before the child is taken from the premises of the school.
- Parents are strongly advised not to leave valuable possessions in their car at any time. It is important to be proactive and prevent incidences of theft occurring on our campus.



RULES AND REGULATIONS – HAIR (September 1, 2025 – June 12, 2026)

The policy handbook of Saint Thomas More School speaks about the hair of our scholars. **Al**l students must comply with the following rules and regulations:

GIRLS:

NO weave or hair extensions

NO hair beads or jewels

NO nail polish

NO hair coloring or dyes

*Braided hair is allowed but must be all natural - no shingles or locked styles!

BOYS:

Traditional hair cut

Short and neatly trimmed

(No afros or braided hair, no locs, designs, faddish paths, dyes, tails or buds)

Hair length must be above the collar of the shirt

*Effective Monday, October 6, 2025, students will not be allowed in class until the hair infractions have been corrected.



P. T. A. MEETING

Our first general P. T. A. Meeting will be held on **Wednesday, September 24, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.** in the hall. We will have the election of officers to serve for the next two (2) years. Interested parents are asked to sign up in the school's office. Please put this date on your calendar and plan to attend.



SCHOOL DISMISSAL

There are two (2) dismissal times: They are as follows:

- Kindergarten Grade 2: Pick up at 2:50 p.m.
- Grades 3 6: Pick up at 3:00 p.m.

Parents should wait near the security booth until their child is brought to the pavilion area by the teacher (Kindergarten – Grade 3).



Students are expected to arrive at school on time. The first bell rings at 8:15 a.m. The second bell rings at 8:30 a.m. which officially begins our school day. Students should be in their classrooms by the second bell. Tardiness is harmful both to your child's education and to the class that is being disrupted by your child's late arrival to school. Please remember the following:

- Your child's bag should be packed before going to bed.
- Your child should go to bed at a reasonable hour.
- Students do not drive. They rely on parents/guardians to get them to school **on time**.
- Parents must leave home at an appropriate time to avoid the traffic that will be encountered on the streets of New Providence.

Parents are not allowed in the classrooms after 8:30 a.m.

Students who are late to school five (5) or more times in a month will receive the first warning letter. If lateness continues, a second warning letter will be issued and a conference will be held with the administration. If a third warning letter needs to be given, the child will be asked to seek enrollment at another school.



IN-CLASS PROCEDURES

- The lunch order is taken in the classroom and sent to the kitchen.
- All food items should be ordered during the homeroom period. Lunch is eaten in the classrooms and students are allowed to go outside for recess.
- Fast food lunches or cooked food are not allowed on campus.



FRUIT, VEGETABLE AND WATER INITIATIVE

Saint Thomas More School will continue with the <u>fruit-vegetable-water initiative</u> at break time. We are focusing on healthy food choices. Every student at break time is encouraged to eat fruits, vegetables and drink water. Other snacks such as yogurt, fruit snacks and nuts can be eaten during the lunch period. We look forward to your complete cooperation.



MY 3D BAHAMIAN BOOK REPORT PROJECT

<u>The Summer Reading Challenge has been extended to Monday, September 22, 2025</u>. The instructions are as follows:

- Create a BIG, colorful, foldable 3D Book report based on a Bahamian book that you have read.
- Materials: Large foldable chart paper (like a giant book), glue, scissors, markers, crayons, pencils
- Cultural decorations: shells, Androsia fabric, straw, Junkanoo felt, dried flowers or leaves, beads
- Printed pictures: Book cover, author or you with the author)
- Pages: Cover, inside, character, setting, problem and solution, ratings, creative tips
- Prizes and surprises will be awarded for full participation



SICKNESS PROTOCOLS

- <u>Children with a fever, cough, runny nose or congestion are not allowed in school regardless of a possible history of allergies or asthma.</u>
- A child who is <u>off sick</u> for any reason should not return to school until he/she is <u>free of all symptoms.</u>
- When a doctor's letter confirming that a child is fit to return to school has been requested, a copy of this letter must be reviewed by the school nurse before the child can be admitted to school.
- Students are encouraged to keep masks in their school bags as they will be needed if the scholar becomes sick during school hours.
- All medical information is **private and confidential**.



HEALTH ASSESSMENT

It is important for all scholars to be healthy in the school environment. Students should <u>remain</u> <u>at home</u> if they are exhibiting any of the following symptoms:

- Fever (Above 100.4° F)
- Sore Throat
- Headache
- Loss of Taste or Smell
- Persistent Cough
- Fatigue/Lethargy
- Shortness of Breath/Difficulty Breathing
- Body Aches/Pain
- Nausea/Vomiting/Diarrhea

MEDICATION

Only prescribed medication will be issued from the school's office. The medication should be sent in a Ziploc bag that is labelled and should have the correct dosage and spoon. The medicine should be collected at the end of the day. Over the counter medication without a proper label <u>will</u> <u>not be allowed</u> at school.



AFTER SCHOOL CARE

After school care runs from 3:00 p.m.– 5:00 p.m., Monday – Thursday. The facilitators are Mrs. Chea (tchea@cec.edu.bs) and Miss Philips (sphilips@cec.edu.bs). The cost is \$10.00 per day. Persons who are not engaged in an afternoon activity will automatically be placed in after care at 3:30 p.m. and charged the daily rate. After school care provides students with homework assistance for all subjects.
